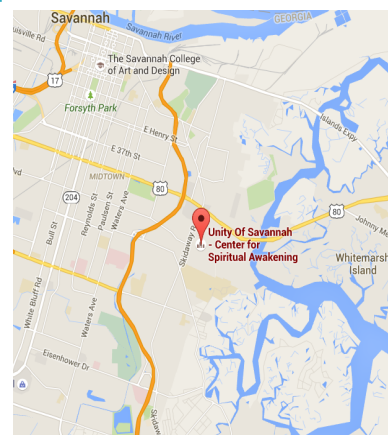


UNITY OF SAVANNAH, GA

UNITY OF HILTON HEAD, SC

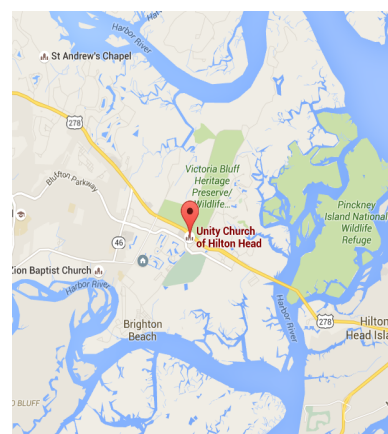

UNITY OF MT. PLEASANT, SC

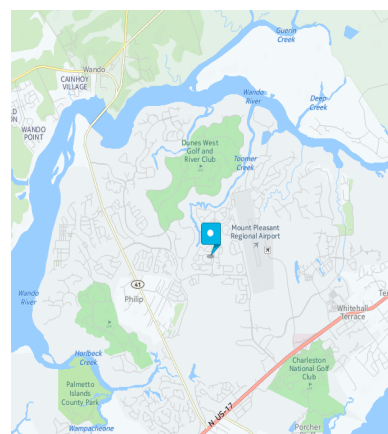
Kimberly Renollet Heck is the Spiritual Leader of Unity of Mt. Pleasant and is on a ministerial path through Unity Urban Ministerial School.

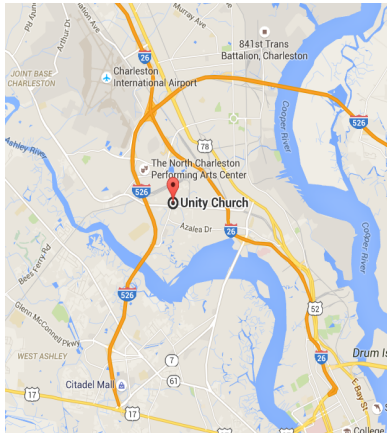

UNITY OF CHARLESTON, SC

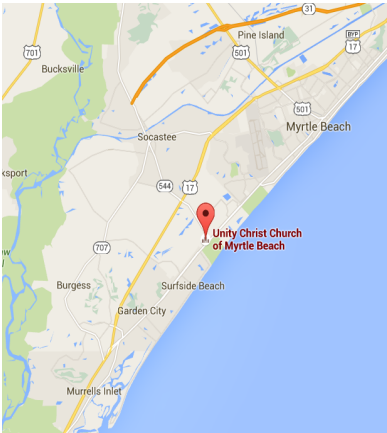

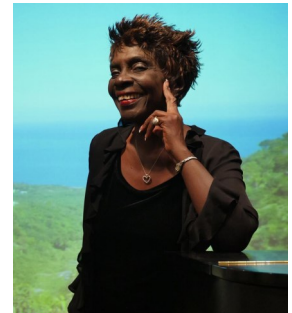
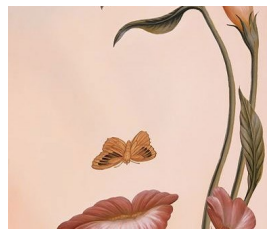

THE LAW OF GIVING AND RECEIVING

“Mommy, mommy,” cried my daughter Lynn, as she pulled on my shirt. “Look what I made, Mommy, just for you!” I turned from the counter where I was working on dinner to see her—a big grin on her 4-year old face, her hands clutching a piece of paper behind her back. I pushed back the tomato I was slicing and slipped to the floor beside her, a smile to match hers on my face. She quickly whipped out the picture—a beautiful if somewhat lopsided rainbow, with reds and greens and blues and yellows brightly colored. “Do you like it, Mommy?” “I love it!” I replied. “Thank you soooo much!” And then we were holding each other in a big hug, each of us filled with love.

Was I giving or was I receiving right then? What would have happened had I decided that I couldn’t receive because I always had to be the giver? Would she have decided it hurt too much to try and give? We would have both lost so much.

Giving and receiving are like breathing out and breathing in. Both are essential for life. There are illnesses such as asthma that affect our ability to breathe in and others such as emphysema that make it hard to breathe out. It doesn’t matter which of these illnesses people have, they are left with less energy, less ability to do what they want. The same holds true for giving and receiving. It doesn’t matter whether we have difficulty in giving freely or receiving freely, our life doesn’t work as well if we can’t do both. It is the Law of Giving and Receiving, not the Law of Giving or the Law of Receiving.

Some people have had their gifts rejected and don’t think other people valued them or their gifts. Others have been through painful experiences where there never seemed to be enough, and they too have difficulty giving. It can feel like things are being ripped away from them-- that they are always in danger of being without, no matter how much they have stockpiled.

Just as some feel unworthy of giving, others feel unworthy of receiving. Those who struggle with “breathing in” hurt the ones they love by refusing to accept the gifts offered in love. They can become takers—taking from others what they need to survive, assuring themselves that they are only taking what they deserve, what they have earned. Many were taught that it is more blessed to give than to receive (or perhaps that they lose control if they receive!) and they want always to be in the position of giver. Yet I have never heard it said that it is more blessed to breathe out than it is to breathe in!

I was blessed with parents who could give freely, which made it much easier for me to feel safe in giving. I have never felt so rich as when I have given and it has usually been easy for me to give. It was harder though, for them to receive and I have also had trouble with that.

I remember well the day in graduate school when a friend lavished praise on me. For just the briefest of moments I let myself enjoy the kind words. Then I moved to the thought that I should have been the one to compliment her. Instantly, I felt terrible that I was such a bad friend. Her lovely gift ended up making me feel bad instead of boosting my self love. I could only take in the tiniest of breaths; it was as though the air was noxious instead of life giving. I wasn’t receiving and I wasn’t giving...

UMMAS **KANUGA** RETREAT SEPT 20-23, 2016

The following information comes from the UMMAS' website page:

This retreat will be held at Kanuga Conference Center in scenic Western North Carolina on 1,400 acres, six miles from Hendersonville at 2300' altitude.

Kanuga is a beautiful facility in a peaceful, wooded setting, with a friendly staff. Kanuga offers an outdoor labyrinth to walk, outdoor exercise trail, playing fields, tennis courts, hiking trails of varying degrees of difficulty, a scenic lake for boating with canoes & rowboats available for free, fishing, swimming in the lake (chilly but available), and a gymnasium.

Enjoy delicious food at the breakfast buffet and family-style lunches & dinners. Accommodations include the 62-room Inn (2 double beds, private bathroom), and 46 two- to six-bedroom cottages (no a/c, ceil-

ing fans or box fans provided - temperature isn't usually a problem at this season. Some cottages have shared bathrooms and a small living room.) There are plentiful rocking chairs overlooking the lake.

Kanuga Conference Center is reached from I-26, and is served by the Asheville, NC airport (30-minute drive) or Greenville-Spartanburg, SC airport (60-minute drive).

Area attractions include the world-famous Biltmore House (French chateau-style mansion, gardens, winery), Carl Sandburg Home National Historic Site (tour of house, goat barns, hiking) very near, the Flat Rock Playhouse, the Blue Ridge Parkway, downtown Asheville, Chimney Rock Park, Pisgah National Forest (Cradle of Forestry, Sliding Rock, waterfalls, Pisgah Inn), excellent golf nearby, shopping in nearby historic downtown Hendersonville, arts & crafts, and antiques.

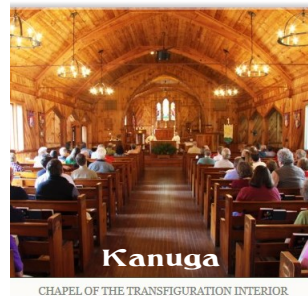

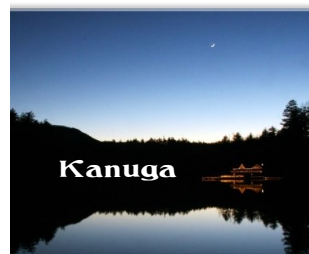

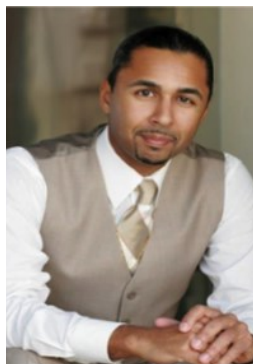

Prior to relocating to Hawaii he served as Pastor at United Church of Jesus Christ For All People in Beaufort, South Carolina and the United Palace Cathedral in New York, New York.

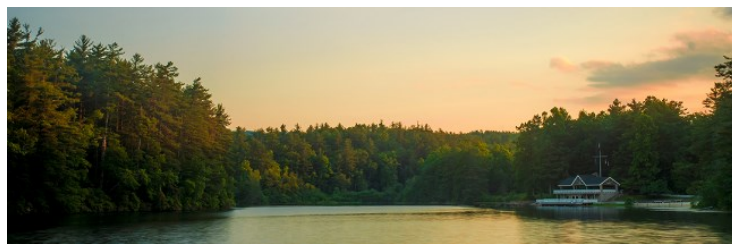
Rev. Jack has served as Senior Minister for various communities including: Unity Christian Church in Memphis, Tennessee; Unity By The Sea in Santa Monica, California; South Side Unity Center of Christianity in Chicago, Illinois; and as Senior Associate Minister at Hillside International Chapel & Truth Center located in Atlanta, Georgia. For the past few years he has traveled abroad providing pastoral and mission support to communities in Dominican Republic; Haiti; Australia; Ghana, West Africa; Iloilo, Philippines; St. Lucia, West Indies; and Bangalore, India.

Rev. Jack was inducted into the Morehouse College, Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Board of Preachers in 2008. He was a member of the USA delegation committee for the Parliament of World's Religions 2009 Conference in Melbourne, Australia.

He served as producer, director and host of Power Hour, a live interactive radio program that promoted a combination of traditional Gospel and Contemporary music with a mixture of the spoken word using Spiritual Principles.

Rev. Jack's desire is to serve as a conduit that fosters a greater sense of self-awareness, spiritual enlightenment and God-consciousness with the communities in which he serves. His hope is to encourage people of diverse backgrounds to transcend differences, bridge communication, and build a coalition that leads to the achievement of a common purpose, a unified and loving community. "When a spiritual teacher named James Twyman and the three Abrahamic faiths recently prayed in a war torn area of Syria, they tried to get as many people as possible to pray for Syria at the same time. Research shows this works, and it did have some effect that day. I loved that idea and participated in it. I wrote to him and other teachers to see if they could coalesce their email lists to make the prayer consciousness even bigger. Never heard back and then, I realized that they could not share their lists just like any organization makes a commitment not to share our lists with anyone.

So, we developed the website below as a starting point. We will be reaching out to spiritual teachers, leaders, and more, to ask them to offer the website to their followers. After you peruse the simple one page site, If you feel led to offer it to your ministries that would be great. No one is making any money, selling anything, espousing teachings or getting any attention from this. It is about as pure as we could make it. Its only intention is prayer and meditation, praying FOR intentions and not against anything/one.

We will send out emails to all registered addresses asking people to pray at a specific time, date and for an intention to get as many people praying/meditating and as many people praying at the same time.

MOTHER EMANUEL NINE MEMORIAL SERVICE

On June 16th Rev. Nat Carter and I (Jim Taylor) attended this moving interfaith memorial at the historic Grace Chapel AME Church on Charles Street in Beaufort.

The memorial marked the first anniversary of the tragic shooting which took place at the Emanuel African Methodist Episcopal Church in downtown Charleston, South Carolina on June 17th 2015. Nine lives were taken including The church's senior pastor, the Rev. Clementa C. Pinckney who was also a Democratic member of the South Carolina Senate, representing the 45th District from 2000 until his death.

The Emanuel AME church was founded in 1816 and it is the oldest African Methodist Episcopal Church in the South, often referred to as "Mother Emanuel". It is the oldest historically black congregation south of Baltimore.

The memorial was organized in a most commendable way by the Unified Interfaith Community Coalition of Beaufort. The sanctuary was packed with representatives of all the mainline churches as well as other faiths including Bahá'í, Judaism, Orisa (a west African based indigenous religion), and Islam. Rev. Nat and I represented Unity at the faith roll call.

Among the most memorable moments for me were the beautiful reading from Bahá'í scripture by Ms. Victoria Smalls and the address by former state representative Bakari Sellers, a friend of the long lamented Clementa Pinckney who had been born in the city of Beaufort.

Nine candles were lit, the name of a victim said with each one. A 10th candle was lit in memory of the Orlando victims. The candle for Sharonda Coleman-Singleton was lit by Victoria who knew her in college. Unknown to the person who assigned the candles to the faith leaders who lit them, increasing the poignancy of this ceremony.

The Lotus Temple, Bahá'í House of Worship, in Delhi, India

This is a prayer from the sacred texts of the Baha'i Faith by 'Abdu'l-Baha, it was read by Ms. Victoria Smalls from the Spiritual Assembly of the Bahá'ís of Beaufort County.

O Thou kind Lord!

Thou hast created all humanity from the same stock. Thou hast decreed that all shall belong to the same household. In Thy Holy Presence they are all Thy servants, and all mankind are sheltered beneath Thy Tabernacle; all have gathered together at Thy Table of Bounty; all are illumined through the light of Thy Providence.

O God! Thou art kind to all, Thou hast provided for all, dost shelter all, conferrest life upon all. Thou hast endowed each and all with talents and faculties, and all are submerged in the Ocean of Thy Mercy.

O Thou kind Lord! Unite all. Let the religions agree and make the nations one, so that they may see each other as one family and the whole earth as one home. May they all live together in perfect harmony.

O God! Raise aloft the banner of the oneness of mankind.

O God! Establish the Most Great Peace.

Cement Thou, O God, the hearts together.

O Thou kind Father, God! Gladden our hearts through the fragrance of Thy love. Brighten our eyes through the Light of Thy Guidance. Delight our ears with the melody of Thy Word, and shelter us all in the Stronghold of Thy Providence.
