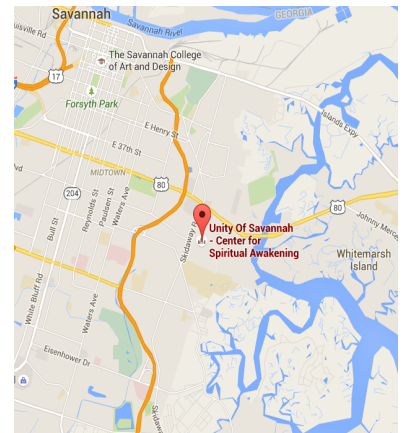


UNITY OF SAVANNAH, GA

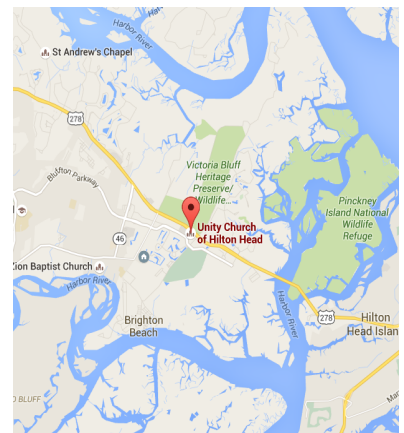


UNITY OF HILTON HEAD, SC

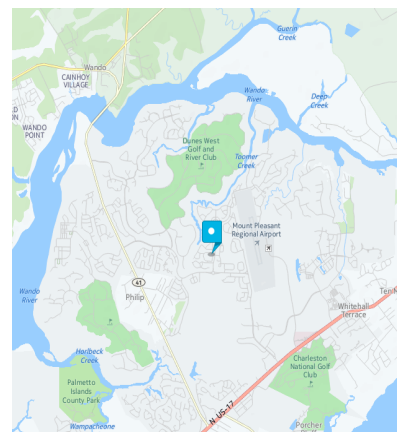
Kimberly Renollet Heck is the Spiritual Leader of Unity of Mt. Pleasant and is on a ministerial path through Unity Urban Ministerial School.

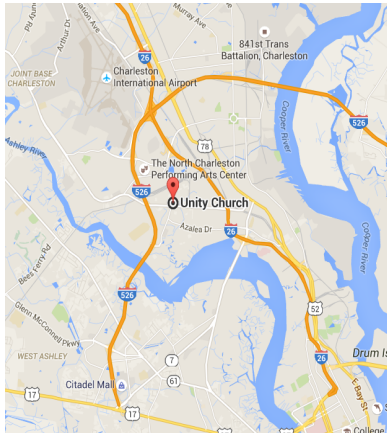

UNITY OF CHARLESTON, SC

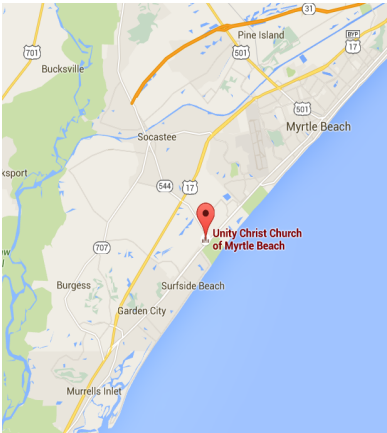

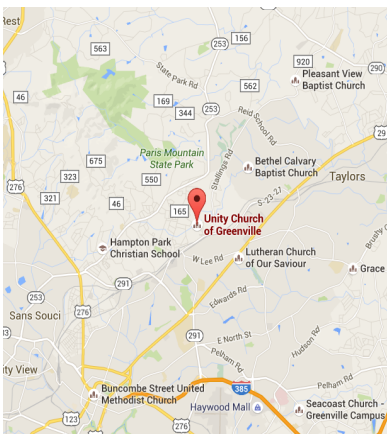

JAN DOW

When I asked Jan for something a little more personal about her life she shared this “As Rev. James King says in his book *Dancing With the Universe* “The real key to manifestation is doing the thing that most inspires you.” I knew from an early age that I would be a poet and write plays. When people would ask me when I was about 5 or 6 “What do you want to be when you grow up?” I would answer, “I want to be a poet and write plays.” I always knew that was the creativity that I was meant to share with the world. I also feel that being a teacher was something I was meant to do. I continue to teach at Osher Life Long Learning as well as other venues.”

In a nutshell we can tell you that Jan Dow is Professor Emeritus in the English Dept. at Western CT State University. That she has won over 150 national playwriting competitions, awards, and honors and has produced numerous productions, workshops, and staged readings around the country. That she is the author of several books, and 20 plays which are published by Samuel French and Phosphene Publishing and are available at Amazon. All true and impressive. She has been a member of Unity for about five years and before that was a member of the Unitarian Universalist Congregation. This certainly tells a lot about her role in the world but very little about the person she truly is. I heard her once characterize herself as someone who seems very open, but in reality is one who guards her deepest thoughts and feelings. Taken out of context you might assume that she has

something to hide or that she is presenting one face to the world and another elsewhere. You would be wrong. I am privileged enough to say that there is perfect continuity between her polished surface and her depths. She said that about herself in the context of her life as a poet, which is not as widely known as her work as a playwright and is grounded in her passion and vitally alive experience as a human being. She has bravely explored life, lived large and has come to a very peaceful and philosophical state of being.

I met Jan when she first started attending Unity of Hilton Head and was immediately taken with her sparkling intelligence, deep wisdom and the humility which informs her gestures and posture, by her authentic warmth and engagement with you. I came to Unity with only small knowledge of the Old Testament and that tainted with an intense dislike of all the “smoting” and such. I particularly disliked the Book of Job which seemed inordinately petty and cruel until I heard Jan speak to our church one Sunday on this profound book. Unity emphasizes the Metaphysical interpretation of the Bible and great teachers such as the Rev. Nickie Golden take that further and invite you to see your own life and circumstances in these ancient stories. Jan Dow has managed to do this with the Book of Job. I openly wept to hear her speak. I was not alone. She has spoken to us on several occasions. I chose to profile her in this issue because she will be speaking this month to Unity of Hilton Head. I for one wouldn't miss it for a great deal of other goodness.

DIVING DEEP

During the fall of 2004, I was in the midst of an intense experience of grieving and loss. A close family member had recently passed away, an intimate personal relationship ended suddenly, and I had no source of steady income. Although I had made a decision to move with my young son to another state miles away from our home in Alabama in pursuit of a new career, I had no idea how that was going to happen, or where I would find the inner or outer resources I needed for the transition. I wasn't eating and I was unable to sleep for more than a few hours at a time.

Spiritual teachers such as Eckhart Tolle and Gangaji recommend the practice of living in the moment. If I am suffering, they suggest that I am struggling against what is and believing that things should be different. My “now moment” was not very pleasant at this time! I could not possibly see how the Universe might be conspiring for my Highest Good.

One morning as I was moving busily around inside my home with no sense of purpose or direction, I realized that I was doing everything I could to run away from the feelings of grief and loss. I remembered an invitation from Gangaji to dive deeply into a challenging situation and to see what was there for me. So I sat down in a chair and said aloud to God, “OK, here I am! Let me feel these feelings to the best of my ability. I'm willing to give this a try”. As I sat, I did my best to slow down my breathing and my thinking, and to investigate what it was like to experience grief. I tried to be as present as possible to what was going on in my body, my mind and my emotions.

Suddenly I felt a most profound and unexpected sense of peace and calm. It only lasted for a moment, but in that moment I had a realization of the Truth that there is a place of stillness and quiet inside me, no matter what is going on around me.

As I rose from my chair, I discovered that I was still upset, afraid and confused. However, I now had an overwhelming feeling that everything was going to be OK. I had found hope in midst of despair!

Eventually, everything did work out for the best for me and my son, and I am so grateful for all the Good in our lives today. I can look back on this experience and use it as a touchstone when I am facing challenging situations. In that one moment of diving deep, my belief in a Power within me shifted to a knowing that wherever I am, God truly is!

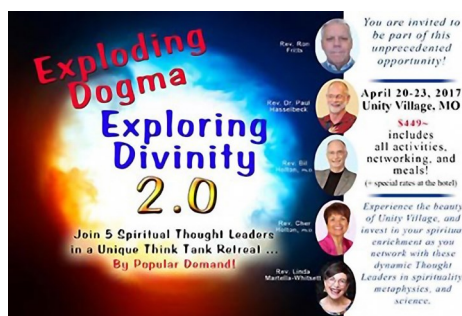

EXPLODING DOGMA, EXPLORING DIVINITY 2.0



Imagine being part of a unique, Think-Tank Style retreat, hosted by five dynamic Spiritual Thought Leaders! I didn't have to imagine it I was there! Much of what I'm sharing here came directly from materials the Revs. Cher and Bil Holton produced to promote this event and I'm shamelessly borrowing partly because I could not have said it better.

"Join this amazing group of people who share your quest for spiritual enrichment, who eagerly embrace the opportunity to talk about science and spirituality, who question beliefs and dogma without shame or judgment, and who have the audacity to explode current beliefs in order to continue growing and living as the Divine Beings they are!

Some history of how it all started: We are six ordained Unity ministers who get together via Skype on a regular basis to stretch our thinking, challenge our beliefs, and dare ourselves to look at unquestioned answers! Five of us got together at Unity Village in August of 2015 for our own spiritual retreat -- and we blew the lid off our assumptions and beliefs!

Towards the end of that weekend in August, we thought what fun it would be to let other folks in on the excitement -- invite them to join us on our next retreat -- expand the discussions and stretch everyone's thinking! That led us to creating this very special, one-of-a-kind retreat! And on

March 31, 2016, it happened! An incredible group of forward-thinking, open-minded individuals came together for four days of unprecedented mind-stretching discussions, challenging topics, interactive sessions, heart-opening meditations, informal networking, dynamic music, and opportunities to really get to know each other on a deeper level -- all within the beautiful and sacred grounds of Unity Village!"

Some of the topics covered were:

- ♥ From DOGMA to AM GOD: Exploding the dogma of our past ... and present! Clearing the way!
- ♥ How Do We Express Our New Understanding? Aligning our words with our Truth: Does it matter (YES!) Why? How?
- ♥ The Message of Music: The science behind the emotion; the need for new lyrics; experiential music-making .

She gave us a private tour of Silent Unity and the opportunity to join the prayer associate in the half-hour silent prayer vigil. What a gift for a Prayer Chaplain!

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RELIGION, SPIRITUALITY AND BUSINESS MODELS

The language of Business and Marketing has become more and more prominent in the vocabulary of Religion. Most religions today are facing a dwindling membership and much greater competition for access to spiritual ideas and practices. It is also the case that the traditional forms of outreach (marketing) are not nearly so effective in our mobile, globally connected world as they were in villages and towns.

While at the *Exploding Dogma* retreat at Unity Village last April, Jim Blake CEO of UWH (Unity World Headquarters) joined us one evening for an hour to share his vision and answer some questions. Mr. Blake served Unity in a number of capacities including heading up the Information Technologies team before leaving for several years to work as an executive in the world of High Tech Business. In talking about Unity’s future he was very optimistic about several initiatives that his team is spearheading to grow our movement and to make our outreach efforts more effective.

During his time with us he pointed out the fact that most successful businesses have identified their “chief differentiators”, those things which make them stand out from their competitors, and have invested serious resources in honing and presenting them. In applying this to Unity he mentioned several things including our unique spiritual perspective in the Christian world and Silent Unity, known worldwide and now in its 127th year of continual 24/7 prayer.

I suggest that drilling down (another business phrase) into the idea of chief differentiators, the idea of Unity’s unique message has at least the following components:

- ♥ God is not “out there”, seated on a throne in heaven. “Neither shall they say, See here! or, see there! for, behold, the kingdom of God is within you.” Luke 17:21
- ♥ That our Wayshower Jesus was not the great Exception but rather the great Exemplar “Truly, truly, I say to you, he who

believes in Me, the works that I do shall he do also; and greater works than these shall he do...” Jon 14:12

- ♥ Our consciousness changes our lives, that Mind and Thought are paramount elements of our theology.
- ♥ We resist dogma. Charles Fillmore famously said that he reserved the right to revise his ideas.

The following day when Rev. Bil Holton was presenting on Science and Spirituality he pointed out that another chief differentiator of Unity was our committed alignment with Science. Charles Fillmore was always looking for and using metaphors from the sciences and believed that if an idea was in contradiction to known scientific facts that it was the idea that must be flawed.

I believe that another differentiator is our openness to all religions “One God, Many Paths” as sources of wisdom and richness. More on that in the Interfaith pages.

Many people are uncomfortable with looking at religion with business models but the truth is that business is concerned with growth, stability, maximizing profit and minimizing waste, and all of these ideas make sense if looked at with an unjaundiced eye and on a more metaphysical level. Big Business has a lot to teach us about the dynamics of large scale organizations.

One strategy to save costs and increase effectiveness is “Mergers and Acquisitions”, the joint efforts of UWM (Unity Worldwide Ministries) and UWH under the leadership of CEO’s Donna Johnson and Jim Blake seem very well advised to this long-time reader of the *Wall Street Journal*. As for Unity, the organization, we do need to market ourselves more effectively, the spiritual market place has never been larger nor offered so many “incentives”! And regarding profit “What profit will a person have if he gains the whole world and forfeits his life?” Mark 8:36. Perhaps the world was never in greater need for our “Product” than it is today.

INTERFAITH NEWS

Interfaith work has gained a greater focus in the Unity Movement. While at Unity Village last month I was able to speak with UWH CEO Jim Blake about Unity's interest in the Interfaith movement and mentioned that Unity did not have an official presence at the Parliament of the World's Religions in SLC, UT in 2015 although there were more than 75 Unity ministers in attendance. Jim told me that there is great interest and that there is work going on with the AGNT (Association for Global New Thought) to develop a vision and strategy that doesn't reinvent the wheel. AGNT has had a deep involvement with the Parliament and will be quite helpful. Among their leadership is the very charismatic Michael Bernard Beckwith of Agape in Los Angeles, who has done much to raise the public's awareness of New Thought.

In the 2015 Parliament the AGNT, of which Unity is a member, succeeded in having New Thought recognized as a separate faithpath. I have had some conversations about that with AGNT's executive director Dr. Barbara Fields who was the Program Director for the first Modern PWR in Chicago in 1993. Her experience helped me craft a proposal for the IPSC (Interfaith Partners of South Carolina) which was approved and I'm pleased to say that Rev. Ed Kosak of Unity of Charleston now sits on our board as the New Thought representative.

Lately I've been corresponding with Rev. Ahriana Platten of Unity of Colorado Springs. She is the liaison from Unity to the Parliament. From Unity of Colorado Springs' website you'll learn that she has traveled the world and experienced its cultural differences and human similarities first hand. That she is a trained initiate in several ancient streams of knowledge that form the foundation of her unique blend of spiritual wisdom.

As an ordained Unity Minister, Ahriana is dedicated to serving people of all spiritual paths and her interactive workshops and sacred rituals provide a powerful balance of

mystical experience and grounded information. She received her calling to serve the Unity Spiritual Center in late 2010 (Rev. Nat Carter was on her advisory committee) and has been the Lead Minister since January of 2011. Ahriana holds a doctorate in Pastoral Counseling Psychology, is a Certified Transpersonal Hypnotherapist, and a Reiki Master/ Teacher of the USUI lineage.

She serves as an Ambassador of the Parliament and I learned from her latest email that she steers their Ambassador Advisory Council as well. She mentioned that there is some interest among Unity Ministers she knows to create a Unity Committee for Interfaith Development, watch these pages for further developments!

In last issue of **CommUnity** I mentioned that the UICCB (United Interfaith/ Intercultural Community Coalition of Beaufort) will be launching "The Spiritual Reconstruction of Beaufort" in parallel with the efforts that created monuments and commemorations of the Reconstruction Era. Rev. Jack Bomar is heading up that committee. This program will begin Friday June 16th with the annual memorial service for the MOTHER EMANUEL NINE, then continuing through Saturday, and a closing event on Sunday 18th will host a gathering to discuss "next steps" for the period July through December.

Rev. Jack has also launched an Interfaith Ministry Fellowship and education program at his United Church on February the 9th a presentation on Native American Spirituality, followed on March 9th with a presentation on the Bahá'í faith by Victoria Smalls. On the 13th of April our beloved Rabbi TZiPi Radonsky presented a "Freedom Seder" in celebration of the Jewish faith, a truly beautiful celebration. On May 11th there will be a presentation on Gullah/ Geechee Spirituality and on June 8th Unitarianism/Universalism. Rev. Jack has much more planned and I'll keep you informed.

PARLIAMENT OF THE WORLD’S RELIGIONS 2018

Toronto--acclaimed the most diverse city in the world by the United Nations and home to six million Canadians—has been chosen as the host city of the 7th Parliament of the World’s Religions, to be convened in November 2018. More than 10,000 people will participate in the 2018 Parliament, which will last for seven days and comprise more than 500 programs, workshops, and dialogues, alongside music, dance, art and photography exhibitions, and related events presented by the world’s religious communities and cultural institutions.

Since the historic 1893 World’s Parliament of Religions in Chicago, modern Parliaments have attracted participants from more than 200 diverse religious, indigenous, and secular beliefs and more than 80 nations to its international gatherings in Chicago (1993), Cape Town (1999), Barcelona (2004), Melbourne (2009), and Salt Lake City (2015). These Parliament events are the world’s oldest, largest, and most inclusive gatherings of the global interfaith movement. As one of the most international, multicultural, and religiously pluralistic cities in the world, Toronto provides a perfect venue for the Parliament of the World’s Religions. More than 140 languages are spoken every day, and at least 47% of Toronto’s population speak a native language other than French or English. Over half were born outside of Canada,

representing more than 200 ethnic origins.

The exemplary effort of Canadians—and especially the people of Ontario—to welcome the stranger and immigrant, honor indigenous communities, and protect the earth with its public initiatives provides inspiration for other global cities that desire to build a better world. Parliament Site Selection Committee Chair Andras Corban Arthen says, “Toronto is a place where important conversations are taking place about reconciliation, environmental approaches, and the integration of immigrant populations. 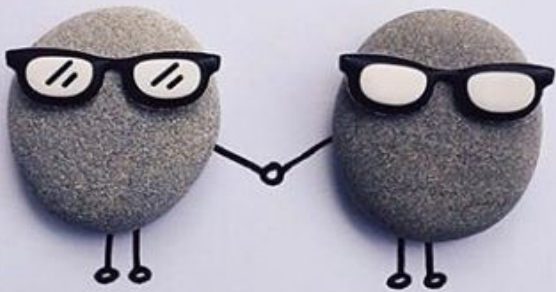
